

Pastor's Message

At a recent Mutual Ministry
Committee meeting I was asked again
why I don't preach from the center aisle.
The sentiment was expressed that the
sermons would be more personal if I left
the pulpit and preached among the
congregation. In the past I mentioned
my discomfort in preaching from the
center aisle due to the fact that worship
is recorded and saved for posterity.
Because an individual can in 20 or more
years from now go and watch a given
service, I was very conscious about
making sure I kept the sermon tight and
didn't wander "off script."

After the Committee meeting I got to thinking: I'm asking the members of Peace to take some risks, to become vulnerable, to step out in faith and invite people to worship. I'm asking us to rethink how we do Church; that the mission field is outside our door, not just across the ocean. If I am asking the congregation to take a risk, then I need

to take a risk as well. So I am willing to learn to preach from the center aisle in the hope that the sermon is more personal. I'm hoping that this change will signal to the congregation that we are in this

together. I'm willing to make adjustments/changes for the sake of proclaiming the Gospel and I hope that you are as well. As we live out our calling to serve our Risen Lord, may we be willing to make adjustments in how we present the Good News of Jesus Christ to meet the changing needs of the culture around us.
