Worship Committee Meeting Times




The meeting times for the Worship Committee has changed from 7pm to 1pm on every third Tuesday of the month. The next meeting for the Worship Committee will be on December 19th!

Next Bible Class will start on *Tuesday mornings, November 21st at* 10:00 a.m.

Books will be available the week prior. You do not need to pay for the books. This is a five-week class on Faithful "Christmas Through the Eyes of Joseph" by Adam Hamilton. You do not need to be a member to attend.

Typically, when Christians explore stories surrounding the birth of Jesus, they focus on Mary, the mother of Jesus. In this study, our focus will be on Joseph, his life, and his role in the birth and life of Jesus. We don't often hear about Joseph because there is relatively little in the Gospels about him. So we have to read between the lines to fill in the picture of Joseph's life, and to some extent we must use our imagination to connect the bits of information we do find in the Gospels. As we do this, we will find that there's more than meets the eye in the New Testament accounts of Joseph's life.
