Crossroads Prison Ministry

While I was working our booth at The Berrien County Youth Fair, I met a gentleman working another booth close to ours. His name is Don Hallock, and he lives in South Haven. We talked quite a bit during the week. He does many things for his Church, and has delivered sermons. We talked about our experiences and I found he is a very interesting person. He told me about The Crossroads Prison Ministries, which he is involved in. When I heard about this, I thought that some of our members might like to participate, so I want to tell you about this program. Crossroads is looking for people who will be "Christian Mentors" to prison inmates all over the US. If you decide to participate, once a month you will receive a Lesson Book in the mail. The prisoners who have signed up for this program will also receive the same book. You will have a chance to read over this book and familiarize yourself with the questions and lessons. Each prisoner will read the lesson and answer the questions, then they mail it back to the Crossroads office. The office will then send these books out to the Mentors all over the US at random. You will get the envelope addressed to you, with the booklet in a return envelope addressed to the prisoner. That is the only way you will know the prisoner's name. As a Mentor, you will read the prisoner's answers, and make notes in the spaces provided. For example, a question might be, "Do you know and Love Jesus?" and the prisoner might answer Yes. Then you could write in the space "What do you think caused to you forget his teachings and place you where you are?" Remember, you will have already read the questions in the lesson and know what it's all about before you receive this. There is also a sheet of paper with the Crossroads header. This is so you can write a letter back to the prisoner. This is the only paper you can use, but you can make a copy if you need more pages. You will sign the letter CPM, for Crossroads Prison Ministries. You NEVER sign your name. You return it to the Crossroads office, who will send it to the prisoner. The prisoner will not ever know

your name or where you live.

This is a nice ministry because with Covid, most Clergymen who visited inmates were forced to stay out of the prisons, so their ministries had to stop, but this is only through the mail, so it can continue.

This would take about 2 hours of your time each month. I thought it was a very nice thing to do, and wanted to share this with you all. Don Hallock said he would be happy to come to our church, or to do a Zoom Meeting with a group of people interested in this program if we would like him to explain it further. I can contact him to do this if we have interest in it. The Crossroads Website is cpministries.org if you would like to visit it for more information.



What an odd Sunday afternoon I had. My mother-in-law recently purchased a family grave plot at a cemetery called Forest Lawn. However, she would not sign the papers until Ken and I looked at the lot and gave our approval. "Do I have to?" I whined at Ken. I could think of better things to do with our Sunday afternoon.

Being the submissive wife, I trekked to Forest Lawn with Ken, looked at my gravesite located in the section called "Murmuring Pines," and listened to the realtor (that's what she was actually called) remind me that what with my head "here" and my feet "there," I would have a grand view of the valley and distant mountains. That's important, I told her. I also told her I did not have plans to stay there very long. Smile.

While the realtor and my mother-in-law conferred over the papers, I looked around at the hundreds of tombstones. It suddenly struck me that I was sitting on the exact spot where my body will rise, should I die before Christ comes. Sitting on that grassy hillside did more to ignite the reality of the Resurrection than hearing sermons or reading essays on the subject.

The Resurrection is not something to be spiritualized away. One day actual spirits will return to actual graves and reunite them to rise. Dead men, one day, shall live, hallelujah!

Lord, You are the Resurrection and the Life and I praise You that eternal life is Your glorious gift to those who believe. One day the dead shall rise - me included! Amen!




