

# Church Challenges

Churches everywhere (regardless of denomination) are facing a common set of problems, not the least of which is dwindling attendance.

For a variety of reasons, we at Peace Lutheran Church have unfortunately witnessed fewer of the faithful in attendance nowadays. At one time, our worship services were filled nearly to capacity every Sunday. Now we typically see 40-45 in attendance.

The first question that comes to mind is why? The second is what can we do about it? Both are very, very good questions. But neither is easy to answer.

As a council member, I have only theories as to why and what. I read a great deal and it seems to me that Church leaders and theologians the world over are as confused as I am. I attended a national Lutheran Faith council two years ago and the same questions were being asked then as now. Maybe we the people just don't see the need for God in our lives anymore. Maybe we're all just too busy for church. I don't know.

But one thing I do know is this: There must be a way to fill the pews again. There must be a way to bring people closer to the salvation we are all promised. That is why YOUR ideas, YOUR participation in church events and especially YOUR prayers are needed to turn the tide even if we have to do it one person at a time. Reach out to others and remember: A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step.
